Our Spiritual Adoption Tree - The 15th week of pregnancy is a critical time for the fetus's growth. The baby's skin remains thin and translucent, but the underlying blood vessels become visible. The baby's taste buds start to develop, and their ears and eyes keep growing into their proper places. The baby's limb motions get more coordinated, and it may begin to suck its thumb. The skeletal system develops with bones becoming harder, and the delicate, soft hair called lanugo begins to cover the baby's body. Additionally, the baby is now producing urine, which is released into the amniotic fluid. While many of these developments are taking place, most mothers won't feel fetal movements until a few weeks later. The fetus typically measures about 4 inches in length and weighs around 2.5 ounces by the end of this week.

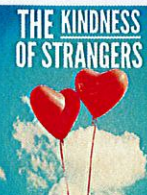

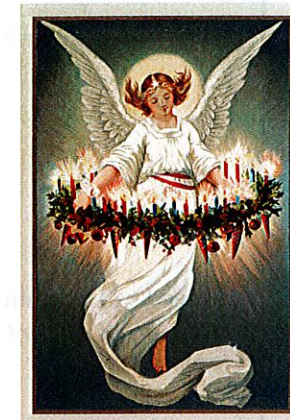
