## From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Well, hello everybody! Hope you all had a good first week of May. This weekend we celebrate Mother's Day. A day to thank and celebrate our mothers for all that they have done for us, the example they have given us, and the love they have shared with us. In the month of May, we also celebrate the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of our Lord.

Last weekend, we welcomed Braxtyn, Hazel, and Josiah to the table of the Lord for the first time. They received their First Holy Communion at Annunciation and crowned Mary at the beginning of Mass. This weekend, we crown Mary at St. Anthony's, and we also welcome William Bernardo to the table of the Lord for the first time. He comes up in the line faithfully every week to receive a blessing, this weekend he receives Jesus in his Body & Blood for the first time.
