From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Hello there, hope you all had a wonderful week. A couple weeks or so I mentioned being a fan of Jesus or being a follower. I got this idea from Dr. Edward Sri in his book *Into His Likeness: Be Transformed as a Disciple of Christ*. Coincidentally, that's the name of the class being offered on Wednesdays until the end of this month. Dr. Sri says that Jesus never had a problem attracting people to his ministry. Throughout the centuries, Jesus has been a source of fascination and intrigue. With all the attention, does that mean that all those interested in him became followers, meaning, really living the life Jesus has called us to or were they just fans of his work? I would venture to say, no, not all were followers; many were just fans.

Being a fan and a follower are not the same thing. A fan could mean that, yes, we go to church, and we do the right things, but are we truly committed to him in seeking his will for our lives? Jesus would much rather have followers as opposed to just fans. Jesus is looking for people willing to commit themselves totally to him as his disciples. **This means that Jesus is not just a part of our lives but is the center of it!**

This decision to commit totally to Jesus represents a turning point in our lives — a complete reordering of one's priorities which are now centered on Christ and not ourselves. As Dr. Sri says, this doesn't mean that we give up everything else, like our dreams, our passions, our success, or comforts, or family or anything else, but that we put our relationship with Christ above everything else. Is this an easy thing to do? Absolutely not, but it's necessary to be a true follower of Jesus. It will take time and effort, but it will be well worth it in the long run. When we give our whole selves to God, we encounter a deeper fullness of life because we have surrendered ourselves to God. It may seem a bit scary to let go of control of our lives to someone else, but God's plan is much better and greater than our own. When we do give ourselves over to God we encounter a deeper peace, a joy and contentment that we have never had before. When we face the trials of life, the sufferings, we don't face them alone, we face them with Jesus by our side and we know what sufferings he endured, and he can help us through whatever life throws our way. Hopefully this helps and encourages us as we walk this road together.

1974: I can't wait to see what the world is like in 50 years!

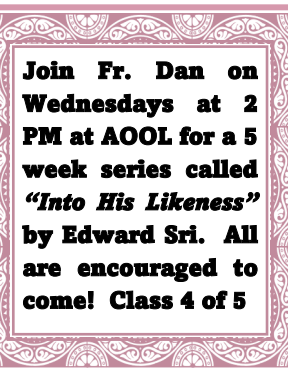

ABOUT THE LOGO FOR THE JUBILEE YEAR The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding

onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which this lead figure embraces, but also of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need. There are the rough waves under the figures, symbolizing the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope. That's why we should pay special attention to the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves. The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency maneuvers to stabilize the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross. The cross in the logo is by no means static, but it is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope, represented in green letters.
