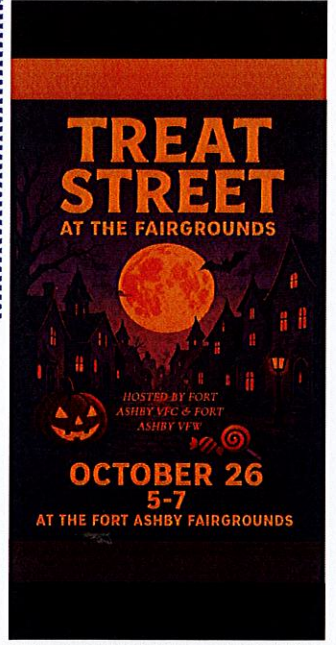


Women's Ministry Group Meeting at AOOL

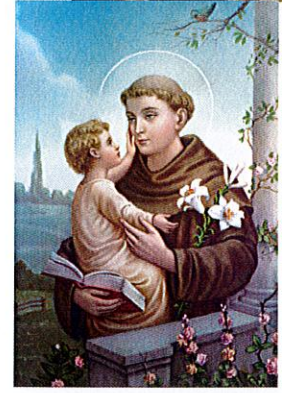

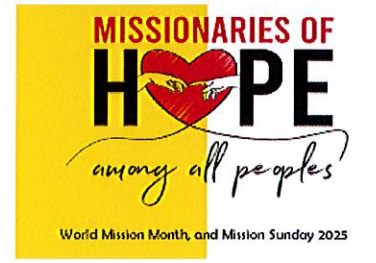
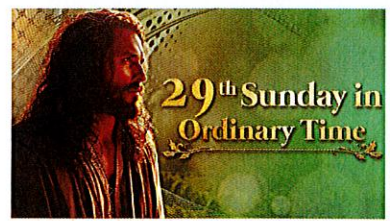

The record keeping software that the diocese and many other dioceses use (ParishSoft) has been given the boot out the door. The new kid on the block, (not *New Kids on the Block* [NKOTB]) Flocknote, has entered the scene. From my understanding, Flocknote started life as an email platform that churches could use to send out mass (get it) emails to their parishioners. I guess it has evolved into a new thing: keeping parish records. How well, time will tell. It went live throughout the diocese on October 1st. Of course there have been glitches in the system; we shall see how they affect us here. It's a huge learning curve because we haven't been given much info on how to use the system, I guess it's OJT. With this new system is a perk that the old one didn't have, access to Bishop Robert Barron's videos.

If you're familiar with him and his online presence then you know how big he is in Catholic media circles. He was a seminary professor and the president of Mendelein Seminary in Chicago. Then he was made an Auxiliary Bishop of Los Angeles, probably because of his media savvy. Now he is the bishop of a diocese in southern Minnesota, Winona-Rochester. He has videos on various saints, on the Mass (a good series to watch), the sacraments, the Catholicism series, and many more. It would be a good thing to peruse his video library and take a gander at a few, if so inclined.

To access this feature log into: flocknote.com, enter your email. Then you will be sent a code to your email that you enter on the website. Magically, you have access to look at your info. If any of it is incorrect, please let the office know. Within the site, you will have access to Bishop Barron's videos. On the right side of the screen, scroll down a smidge and you will see a box that allows you to enter Word on Fire Engage (WOF Engage).

On Saturday we had a famous magician and illusionist, Derrick the Magnificent to come and entertain us all. Hope all who came had a good time. I want to thank all who came out and all who helped make this event a success, especially Derrick the Magnificent for his time and talent.
