



### ST. PATRICK



Patrick uses shamrock in an illustrative parable

St. Patrick is depicted with a shamrock in detail on a stained glass window in St. Benin's Church, Kilbennan, County Galway, Ireland

Legend credits Patrick with teaching the Irish about the doctrine of the Holy Trinity by showing people the shamrock, a three-leafed plant, using it to illustrate the Christian teaching of three persons in one God.

In pagan Ireland, three was a significa number and the Irish had many triple deities, a fact that may have aided Patrick in his evangelization efforts when he "held up a shamrock and discoursed on the Christian Trinity

#### Patrick banishes snakes from Ireland

Ireland was well-known to be a land without snakes, and this was noted as early as the third century by Gaius Julius Solinus, but later legend credited Patrick with banishing snakes from the island.

The earliest writings about Patrick ridding Ireland of snakes is by Jocelyn of Furness in the late twelfth century, who says that Patrick chased them into the sea after they attacked him during his fast on a mountain. ## From the Desk of Father Dan

#### Greetings!

Did anyone notice last Sunday the snow squalls in the area? At times it was snowing to beat the band or was it snowing like a banshee? Either way, it was coming down. I left St. Anthony's after Mass, and it was snowing hard, but by the time I got out to Route 28, the sun had come out and the snow has stopped, crazy weather.

This Tuesday we commemorate the life of St. Joseph, the earthly father of Jesus and husband of Mary. In reality there is not much known about him, plenty of speculation, and he does not speak at any place in the Gospels. He is more known for his actions than his words. What we do know is not much, just from Scripture. The Gospel of Mark and the writings of St. Paul do not mention him. He's only mentioned at any length in Matthew and Luke. Each of these two Gospels contains a genealogy of Jesus which, of course, contains Joseph. He last appears in Luke when he and Mary find Jesus in the temple talking with the religious leaders.

Traditionally, the Catholic Church sees Mary as a widow, since no mention of Joseph after the finding in the temple scene in Luke. He is not present as Jesus begins his public ministry, not present at the first miracle recorded, the Wedding Feast at Cana, or at any other events where Mary is present. Based on Jewish tradition, if he had been alive at Jesus' death, he would have been the one to take charge of his son's body, not Joseph of Arimathea. Also, if he'd been alive at Jesus' death, Mary would not have been entrusted to John, the beloved disciple. Why would Jesus do that if his father was still around? In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is referenced as the carpenter's son. This reveals the profession of Joseph. Jesus would have trained under his father as an apprentice.

Interestingly, there are some writings, not scriptural, that speak more about Joseph and seem to contradict Church Tradition, especially when it comes to the assumption of his death at an early age in the life of Jesus. The gospel of James (circa 150 AD), an apocryphal writing, presents Joseph as an old man chosen by God to watch over Mary. A 5th century biography says that Joseph lived to be about 90 years old and was a widower with several children from a previous marriage, given charge of Mary to watch over her (Note: Mary would have been a pre-teen or a young teenager of about 12-14 years old at the time). Where does this leave her parents? I don't really know if we are to entertain these accounts as viable possibilities. Joachim and Anne do not appear in Scripture but are mentioned in the writings of James. I have not read James' or any other apocryphal writings of the day that speak of Joseph, or even Joachim and Anne, so I can't speak to what they say about them. I'm going to stick with what Church Tradition has to say, until I find out otherwise, but that won't be until the other side.

The veneration of Joseph began around the 9th century and continued to grow. In 1889, Pope Leo XIII issued an encyclical, *Quamquam pluries*, where he presented Joseph as a model father, husband and as a protector of the Church. Pope Pius IX, in 1870, made Joseph the patron of the universal Church. In 1955, Pope Pius XII declared May 1st a feast day dedicated to St. Joseph the Worker. That is because he is considered the patron saint of workers. The month of March is dedicated to him, and he is the patron saint of our diocese. St. Joseph, pray for us.

How's this? Do you agree? "It's not that your parents love their grandkids more than you. It's that their grandkids remind them of you as a child. And it's like getting to love that version of you all over again."
