

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

As we enter the first weekend in May, we are celebrating four young people who will receive their First Holy Communion. What a special time for them. The annual tradition of the May Crowning will be with our First Communicants at AOOL. Let me introduce those who will receive their First Holy Communion: Owen James, Harlow and Noriah Martz and Lillian Sisk. We congratulate them for this fine achievement in their journey of faith. May they continue to grow in their faith and see the Eucharist as truly divine food for the soul, treasuring it always when they come forward to receive Jesus.

As our young people receive Jesus for the first time, maybe it's a good reminder of what we all receive every time we come forward to receive the Eucharist. The Catholic Church says the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life; all the other sacraments are oriented toward it (Catechism, 1324). "In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: 'Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking'" (Catechism, 1327). Another term for the Eucharist is *Holy Communion*. This means we unite ourselves to Jesus, making us sharers in his Body and Blood. It unites all of us together who come forward to take in our Savior. Jesus willingly made a sacrifice for us, to give himself to us. In the Mass, Jesus makes present the sacrifice he made for us. What we do is a memorial, remembering that event. Because it is Jesus we receive, his Body and Blood, we receive the sacrament of sacraments (Catechism, 1330.b). Because it is Jesus we receive, it is important for us to remember to receive with reverence. The Church calls for a bow and reception in the hand or on the tongue. When we come forward, even though we have done it hundreds or thousands of times, we come forward as if it was our first. The profoundness of it should not be lost on us. I pray for each of our first communicants as they come forward. I pray that all of us (and myself) receive Jesus as if it was the first time every time.

This weekend our Knights of Columbus are hosting their *Cinco de Mayo* events at AOOL (after Saturday Mass) and at St. Anthony's after Mass. Ready to eat and celebrate? I did a little research. It's interesting to know the holiday is more popular in the United States than even in Mexico, where it originated as a celebration of the victory of the Mexican Army over the French at the Battle of Puebla in 1862. However, the Mexican Army was defeated at the second Battle of Puebla and the French eventually occupied Mexico City. The holiday's ties to the US date back to 1862 in California. A regional holiday until around the 1980s, it became more of a nationwide holiday, due to beer and liquor advertisements, and the migration of more people of Mexican heritage to other parts of the country. Today, it's more of a celebration of Mexican American heritage than a celebration of the victory won at the Battle of Puebla in the United States. In Mexico, it is celebrated by parades, festivals, and reenactments of the battle. This is purely a Mexican holiday, not celebrated by other Hispanic cultures. This holiday has no real meaning if you were to ask someone from Puerto Rico, Honduras, Bolivia, Dominican Republic, or Guatemala. Viva México!
